


Venue- True Light International Orphanage

As a part of Children's Day celebration, a screening and treatment camp was organised by the Department of Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry at True Light International Orphanage located in Ambedkar Nagar, Bengaluru on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The team of doctors included staff – Dr Madhu K, Dr Srinivas L S, Dr Ravi Kumar S, Post Graduate students – Dr Inzar, Dr Harshini and Interns Dr Mark and Dr Keerthana. The orphanage housed a total of 16 children who ranged in age from 8 years to 15 years. Preventive and primary treatment was successfully given to all inmates. The camp started with information on oral hygiene maintenance and demonstration of brushing techniques followed by a thorough preliminary oral examination of all the children. All 16 children received topical fluoride application while other treatments like pit and fissure sealants, preventive resin restorations and other conservative restorations were done only in children requiring them. The camp successfully concluded with arbother session of oral health care instructions and thanks giving.







The trust housed a total of 31special children who ranged in age from 6 years to 27 years.Arrangements were made for the inmates to be brought to KLE Society's Institute of Dental Sciences whereupon they would be treated free of cost.


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# Oral Cancer Control Program




Approach:

Biocon Foundation has implemented integrating health and technology by a mobile health (mHealth) approach from a decade to improve the ability of Frontline Healthcare Providers (FHPs) in low- resource settings for early detection and prevention of to prevent and diagnose oral cancer at an early stage. The Oral Cancer Control Program uses a Mobile Health (mHealth) module by which FHPs connect to specialists through a mobile app to capture data and images of oral abnormalities in resource-constrained settings. The platform enables the creation of electronic health records and facilitates screening for Oral Cancer. To strengthen the government program, Community Based Assessment Checklist (CBAC) form will be used to collect information on risk habits and identify individuals at risk for oral cancer.

The overall survival of Indian patients with oral cancer is 20-25% lower than that reported for patients in developed countries. Diagnosis is often delayed in low resource settings, patients living in rural areas have poor access to primary health care, low health literacy, and problematic adherence to follow up. Diagnosis of oral cancer at an early stage offers the best chance for improved survival, decreased morbidity, and cost of treatment.

However, the conventional method of screening has a few limitations. Poor patient compliance for follow up is one of the main drawbacks, Rigid follow up to monitor the progression of Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders (OPMDs) is very critical in oral cancer program. The other limitations include lack of permanent portable record of data after screening, slow rates of information transfer and poor communication between primary provider and the specialist. The mHealth system provides a continuous two-way communication, enabling patient triaging and tracking. This interface helps to connect specialists with the patients for diagnosis. It also creates an opportunity for follow up and referrals. This unique approach has a robust surveillance to monitor high-risk groups in population- based and opportunistic screenings. The simple interface lends itself to effective data capture by health providers at all levels. The screening process is evidence-based, as every patient has a unique patient identity correlated with their habit history and clinically relevant photographs. The program aims at reducing oral cancer burden and financial liabilities for the patients and improving the treatment outcome. Started in 2011, the program aims to strengthen the current government health initiatives and has been successfully implemented in various resource-constrained settings in partnership with Governments of Karnataka, Rajasthan, Assam, and Nagaland. The program was designed to identify high-risk population in both community and workplace settings and aims to strengthen the current government health programs with implementation focusing on areas with high disease burden. Oral Cancer Screening (OCS) was conducted at the Karadibetta Estate in Alur, Hassan. The screening was done on 14-02-2022. Trained Frontline Healthcare Providers (FHPs) performed oral visual examination for early detection of oral cancer and Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders (OPMDs).

FHPs performed oral visual examination followed by technology based (mHealth) screening. A total of 136 individuals participated in screening, out of which, 77 participants were enrolled for mHealth screening. Amongst the total targeted participants screened, 75 had positive habit history and lesion positive (OPMDs) in 23 (30%). Habit positive patients were referred for tobacco cessation clinics at PHCs and for further management. Education for oral hygiene maintenance, self-mouth examination and awareness was provided for all the participants. Toothpastes were distributed to all the participants to promote oral health hygiene. 75 individuals were recommended for follow up. Biopsies were carried out for 8 participants on 09/05/22.

In addition to screening for oral cancer, screening program for breast cancer was also carried out. The total number of patients screened were 34. Of the total participants screened, 6 individuals were referred for Mammogram (MMG) & Ultrasonography (USG).

#### **Conclusion:**

At Karadibetta Estate, 23 participants were identified as having OPMDs, 75 were identified as positive for risk habits and all risk individuals were recommended for follow up. Of the total participants screened for breast cancer, 6 patients were referred for MMG & USG.



Oral Cancer Screening (OCS) was conducted at the Tata Coffee Estates in Ubban, Bage and Dythapura. The screening was done on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022. Trained Frontline Healthcare Providers (FHPs) performed oral visual examination followed by technology based (mHealth) for early detection of oral cancer and Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders (OPMDs).

The program included awareness talk by specialists on the ill-effects of chewing tobacco. The participants were counselled and encouraged to perform a self-mouth examination, and on the importance of habit cessation. A pledge was taken by the participants to quit the habit of tobacco and areca-nut use. The participants were educated with a short video to spread awareness on oral cancer and the harmful effects of tobacco on health.

FHPs screened a total of 276 individuals in three different cohorts followed by onsite specialist examination, out of which, 238 were positive for habits, 63 were identified as suspicious oral lesions (Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders) and 36 had tobacco-induced minor oral changes (Paan chewers mucosa). All risk individuals positive for habit and having oral mucosal lesions were referred for tobacco cessation clinics at PHCs and for further management. Education for oral hygiene maintenance, self-mouth examination and awareness was provided for all the participants. Toothpastes to all participants were distributed to promote oral health hygiene, and multivitamin capsules for risk individuals. 99 individuals were recommended for follow up. All the patients having suspicious oral lesions are advised for biopsy and standard treatment care will be provided

Additionally, surveillance of patients who had undergone biopsies on 09/05/22 was carried out at Karadibetta Estate, Hassan. Of the total 9 patients who had undergone biopsies, some patients have reduced the habit and 1 patient has quit the habit.



Oral Cancer Screening (OCS) program was conducted at the Tata Coffee Estates in Merthikhan, Balehonnur in Chikkmagaluru. The screening was done on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022. Trained Frontline Healthcare Providers (FHPs) performed oral visual examination followed by technology based (mHealth) for early detection of oral cancer and Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders (OPMDs).

An awareness talk was given by the specialist on the ill-effects of chewing tobacco and on the importance of quitting the habit. The participants were shown how to perform a self mouth examination and were encouraged for the same.

FHPs screened a total of 119 individuals, followed by onsite specialist examination, out of which, 87 were positive for habits, 36 were identified as suspicious oral lesions (Oral Potentially Malignant Disorders) and 28 had tobacco-induced minor oral changes (Paan chewers mucosa). All risk individuals positive for habit and having oral mucosal lesions were referred for tobacco cessation clinics at PHCs and for further management. Education for oral hygiene maintenance, self-mouth examination and awareness was provided for all the participants. 87 individuals were recommended for follow up.

Molecular cytology testing was carried out for 11 participants. All the patients having suspicious oral lesions are advised for biopsy and standard treatment care.




### **National Tooth Brushing Day 2022**



1. Place bristles along the gumline at a 45 degree angle.Bristles should contact both the tooth surface and the gumline.
